## CONDITIONS

### ALL PROJECTS

1. The Animal Ethics Committee (AEC) is relying on the understanding that the information provided by the investigators is: comprehensive, complete, true and accurate as stated in their Application for Ethics Approval.
2. The AEC approve this application as it pertains to animal welfare issues and as per the Committee's Terms of Reference and does not assume responsibility for the appropriateness of any other aspects of this project undertaken by the listed personnel.
3. The Principal Investigator is responsible for obtaining and providing all necessary permits including matters relating to OHS and IBC to AEC secretary and co investigators prior to the commencement of the project.
4. Any proposed change in protocol and the reasons for that change, together with an indication of ethical implications (if any) and relevant permits, must be submitted to the Animal Ethics Committee for approval.
5. The Principal Investigator must notify the Secretary of the Animal Ethics Committee of:
  - Any changes to the approved investigators
  - Any adverse effects of the study on the animals and steps taken to deal with them
  - Any unforeseen events
6. A Progress Report must be submitted annually and at the conclusion of the project. Special emphasis must be given to ethical matters, unexpected mortality and animal welfare issues.
