Reviewer 1: The article entitled: "Interval Colorectal Carcinoma: An Unsolved Debate" processes one of the very elusive and peculiar research questions in contemporary clinical oncology. These are colorectal cancer cases commonly overseen by regular screenings and therefore treatment delay affecting prognosis is likely to occur. If we use terms (Interval AND Colorectal AND Carcinoma) in PubMed database using limitation to search for keywords only in the Title we find only two respective articles. If we expand search criterion to encircle title and abstract but limit it to the review style articles like the one in submission we come to the 63 papers count. Out of these many articles are dealing with other clinical issues mentioning interval colorectal cancer only marginally and without clear focus on it. Based on highly attractive topic and unexploited research question, presence of literature gap in this area as well as the quality of manuscript, I would like to warmly recommend this paper for publishing in World Journal of Gastroenterology.
