Thank you for the information concerning the manuscript No. 21585 entitled “**Is liver biopsy still needed in children with chronic viral hepatitis?**”.

We find the Reviewers’ comments valuable and contributing to the improvement of the article. The manuscript has been reviewed accordingly and the revised paper is attached. Our answers to queries of the Reviewers and the consequent changes are described in detail below **in bold**. All changes made to the manuscript are highlighted in yellow.

*Reviewer #1:*

The review written by Pokorska-Śpiwak et al. summarizes the indication and usefulness of liver biopsy in pediatric patients with liver diseases. The review is well written, but there are some concerns that need to be addressed.

Major point The significance of liver biopsy for the diagnosis of inherited metabolic disease should be mentioned

**In this review we aimed to focus on the role of the liver biopsy in children with chronic viral hepatitis. However, we added relevant information on other indications for the liver biopsy to the manuscript (part Introduction) according to the Reviewer: “Liver diseases of different etiologies (*e.g.*, viral, autoimmune, nonalcoholic, and drug-induced hepatitis), as well as inherited metabolic diseases, cholestasis, liver tumors, acute liver failure, abnormal liver tests of unknown etiology, and others are considered as indications for liver biopsy in children.”**

Minor point Liver biopsy by transjugular approach can be safely performed in some patients with coagulopathy. It should be mentioned.

**Thank you for this remark. This information was added to the manuscript in part COMPLICATIONS AND CONTRAINDICATIONS: “In case of high-risk patients (with coagulopathy and severe liver disease, pancytopenia, or clinically evident ascites) and in patients with contraindications to percutaneous liver biopsy (e.g., haematological conditions), a transjugular instead of percutaneous approach is recommended”**
