*It is a brief review on the current pharmacological treatment of arterial hypertension. Although there is nothing fundamentally new in this review, except probably the issue of keeping or not beta-blockers as first-line therapy, it is useful by reinforcing some old but true concepts, such as the importance of BP reduction to target values regardless of the anti-hypertensive drug being used. There are only some minor corrections to be done in the text, such as the p-value (00.4) in the last paragraph of page 6, and the authors' names of reference #8.*
