As the biomedical statistician I declare that the statistical methods used in the descriptive and analytical statistics, were appropriate and according to the aim of the study and its variables. This is a mainly descriptive and comparative study, whether there are differences between UC and CD patients. In the case of continuous variables it is correct to describe with median and range, because the data didn't have normal distribution. For comparison, they used the Mann Whitney test for independent groups, which is correct, because it wasn't paired data. In the case of categorical variables it is correct to describe with absolute frequency and percentage and compare with Chi2 test, when the sample was greater than 20. When the sample was smaller they used Fisher's exact test.

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
