While hepatobiliary surgery is conducted routinely, iatrogenic liver injury which calls for liver transplantation for the recovery seems to occur rarely. In addition, surgical resources and skills differ from country to country. Thus the referee feels that it is moderately difficult to discuss this topic based on the serial literature. Nevertheless, the investigators experienced accumulated surgical cases for rescue of iatrogenic severe liver injury and also successfully reviewed the related papers from the scientific point of view.
