Some things that need to be clarified: 1. How to identify the population that would benefit from these interventions. 2. FD, GERD, IBS are not generally treated with surgery 3. Offering an alternative to drugs and surgery for treating gastrointestinal disorders but recommending the use of low-dose antidepressants as treatment for depression in order to alleviate digestive symptoms is contradictory. A side effect of antidepressants is nausea and GI symptoms. 4. The criteria that are part of the "new paradigm" and the recommended interventions are unclear.
