The manuscript concerns many clinically important issues, it is written clearly and concisely, and material is very balanced. The article, undoubtedly, will be interesting for the audience of the journal. The abstract would be more attractive if it included solid data, for example, on the prevalence of metabolic complications after bariatric surgeries. The use of abbreviations should be unified throughout the text.
