Thank you for your review of our manuscript. We endeavored to make the changes asked for by the reviewers. After thoroughly going through the manuscript again we decided to change the title slightly so now it reads, Pancreatic Acinar Cell Carcinoma: A review on molecular profiling of patient tumors.” We updated some of the references as well to make sure we had all of the latest citations. We have endeavored to respond to the reviewers comments as we best could within the limitations of the data available. We will address the comments beginning in the next paragraph.

Reviewer 1. They thought a graph of the mutations would be better than a table. Although we agree, it meant going through all of the studies which presented data differently and trying to come up with a way to present it all in a similar fashion. Due to some of the problems in going across studies this way we decided using a table would be the simplest way to proceed.

Reviewer 2. There was interest in whether there were mutations in more than one gene, specifically in the *APC* and *CTNNB1* genes with the *BRCA2* or *RBI* genes. Going back through the data only one patient had a tumor with a mutation in both the *BRCA2* and *CTNNB1* genes. This information was added to the Molecular Biology section of the paper. Additionally, we were asked to make sure our use of abbreviations occurred only after use of defining the abbreviation. We went through the paper and we think we have taken care of this issue.

Reviewer 3. A few grammatical errors were found. This was due to the use of tracking our changes since we have four authors. We have gone through the manuscript and made sure these problems were addressed.
