SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is a very interesting case report on a new and original technique to achieve hemostasis in case of bleeding after EUS-guided debridement of pancreatic pseudocysts. Versatility is a necessary skill for advanced endoscopists. Language editing is perfect. These are my comments: - I suggest to change the title in order to indicate that we are



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talking about bleeding after EUS-guided debridement of pancreatic pseudocysts - "In addition, a pre-procedural magnetic resonance cholangiopancreatography (MRCP) was performed following injection of contrast into the biliary system." What is that? MRCP does not require contrast to exactly draw pancreaticobiliary ductal system! - I suggest to remove any colloquial expression ("two birds, one stone", "how can we change the dangerous condition?"), they are funny but this is a scientific report - given the high risk of post-procedural morbidity, why the authors decided to perform cross sectional imaging after 2 months?

SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

I have read with great interest the manuscript entitled, "A small balloon controls massive hemorrhage (with video): a case report" by Wang et al. The authors report a single case of successful hemostasis using a balloon dilater in massive bleeding during EUS guided drainage for pancreatic pseudocyst. The manuscript is well written and



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easy to read. The authors should give extra cautions to the readers and should be unbiased. In my opinion, this case should have been treated with surgical procedure, not EUS guided drainage, from the beginning. The authors state that the the patient was an inoperable situation due to serious pancreatogenic portal hypertension. I totally disagree with this statement. EUS guided drainage is much more dangerous for a patient with pancreatogenic portal hypertension. Overall the manuscript is well written and interesting but there are too many statements in favor of EUS guided drainage over surgical approach. The authors also should address several minor points. # The title should include a word such as pancreatic psuedocyst, and EUS guided drainage. For example, "a case of successful hemostasis using a balloon dilater in massive bleeding during EUS guided drainage for pancreatic pseudocyst". # On page 5 line 4 from bottom: "MRCP revealed one a homogeneous..." should be "MRCP revealed a homogeneous...". # The authors should describe more detail about transfusion. What was transfused? Packed red blood cell only? Fresh frozen plasma? How much? # Page 6 line 5 from top: What do the authors mean by saying "international therapy"?
