In this case report authors would like to emphasize that they according to their best knowledge, first time report in the medical literature in the English language, a case of Gardner's syndrome presented with gastrointestinal perforation and bleeding. This case report is interesting and well described and documented. However, the discussion section is too long and describes well known facts. Instead that, the authors need to revise their paper and in Introduction and Discussion sections they need to focus and describe in more details the importance of novel information (gastrointestinal perforation and bleeding in patients with Gardner's Syndrome) for the scientific community and clinical practice in comparison with the current statement in the medical literature.

**Response to the Reviewer (02440510)**

Dear Reviewer, thank you for your positive comment about our case presentation. As you know, gardner's syndrome is a very rare syndrome. Therefore, it is very unlikely that a doctors will experience multiple gardner syndromes throughout life. It is far less likely to encounter complicated Gardner's Syndrome cases. A limited number of complicated Gardner's syndromes have been published in the literature and a significant number of cases have been written by dentists. There are three important characteristics of this phenomenon: First, adenosquamous tumor developed from polyposis Second, the combination of bleeding and perforation (triggering perforation bleeding) The third is that although the patient is known to be a gardner, the prophylactic colectomy has not been done or neglected.
