The manuscript is very well done and its topic is very important for the treatment of gastric cancer that is very challenging, especially in Asian countries. The authors report important data on how to deal with the peritoneal carcinomatosis from gastric cancer that is usually associated with a poor outcome. Many new aspects such as the



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neoadjuvant laparoscopic heated intraperitoneal chemotherapy (NLHIPEC) after systemic chemotherapy, and the bidirectional use of neoadjuvant intraperitoneal and systemic chemotherapy (NIPS) are reported. The manuscript is very well written and show modern and appropriate concepts. I suggest the publication as it is.

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
