SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

In this editorial Piché discusses the importance of the surrounding tumor environment of ovarian cancer. This “editorial” raises some important points that could be of value to a general audience, but which are not surprising to investigators in the field. Most



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people would agree that tumors are complex and heterogeneous and that interactions between cancer cells and their environment are bidirectional. However, one specificity of ovarian cancer is the presence of malignant peritoneal effusions that constitute a unique tumor environment. This specificity would justify the publication of the editorial. However, although the author points are well taken, they might be obvious to people in the know. The publication of this editorial, would benefit from the presence of accompanying review(s) or research papers on the same topic. Suggestion: From a therapeutic point of view, the real issue is how these tumor effusions can be efficiently targeted by current or incoming therapies, and, possibly, how/if changes in effusion composition in response to conventional therapies might be involved in cancer progression/relapse. May be the author could briefly better discuss these points.
