- (1) Perhaps you would wish to comment on why some herbals give a clinical response in the face of no endoscopic or histological response.

As we have described in discussion, this may be due to short duration of studies and possible slow action of herbal medicines. Moreover, the scoring system used to assess the mucosal appearance macroscopically is prone to inter-observer variability.

- (2) Are the herbals treating coexisting irritable bowel syndrome in patients who have inflammatory bowel disease?

Yes, symptoms of IBD and IBS are almost similar but IBD is more severe. IBS can be a subject of further meta-analysis.
