<b>Introduction</b>	4	The current standard of care and contributions of this case—with references (1-2 paragraphs)	5
<b>Timeline</b>	5	Information from this case report organized into a timeline (table or figure)	5
<b>Patient Information</b>	6a	De-identified demographic and other patient or client specific information	5
	6b	Chief complaint—what prompted this visit?	5
	6c	Relevant history including past interventions and outcomes	5
<b>Physical Exam</b>	7	Relevant physical examination findings	6
<b>Diagnostic Assessment</b>	8a	Evaluations such as surveys, laboratory testing, imaging, etc.	6
