Below I have commented on each of your critiques.

Reviewer 1:

- 1- I encourage the authors to do literature review and summarize other similar cases in a comparison table to elucidate difference between different cases
 - A literature review was added.
- 2- In the treatment, the patient was treated by EPOCH (which) include prednisolone and after brackets written that the regimen is given without prednisolone. Do the author mean that she was treated with EOCH?
 - Chemotherapy regimen was changed to EOCH.
- 3- Figure legends are missing. Detailed description of each figure should be given.
 - Legends have been added to all the figures
- 4- Figure 1 is of low resolution (CT images) if improved it will be better
 - Figure 1 has been magnified and split into 3 separate images for clarity
- 5- Figure 2 is the EGD picture and not colonoscopy as shown in the text (please revise)
 - Figure 2 has been removed. This was originally a figure of the proximal colon with nodular mucosa. Yet, the nodularity of the mucosa was not identified well in the image and thus removed.
- 6- After which duration endoscopy was repeated? How frequent do the author recommend repeat endoscopy?
 - Repeat colonoscopy was completed 6 months after diagnosis. There is no gold standard for monitoring EATL and repeat endoscopies can be decided on a case-by-case basis with guidance from oncology and further repeat imaging.
- 7- A conclusion statement is missing
 - Conclusion section has been created.

Reviewer 2:

- 1 Text in table 1 is same as case history. Table-1 should be removed.
 - table 1 was removed. Originally table 1 was placed as this was mentioned in the CARE checklist guidelines however I agree that this is redundant.
2. Figure 2 (nodules in ileum)and 4 (strictures) are not appreciable, should be removed.
 - figures 2 and 4 were removed
3. Case presentation- last paragraphs- sentence "The patient was started on chemotherapy with EPOCH (Etoposide, Prednisolone, Oncovin, Cyclophosphamide, and Hydroxydaunorubicin) without prednisolone given concern for colonic perforation."- IS NOT UNDERSTANADBLE ?
 - Chemotherapy regimen was changed to EOCH.
4. Conclusion is very poor. Please revise conclusions- (In conclusion, our patient continues to undergo therapy. Her subsequent PET scan and endoscopy have identified persistent disease. Our case is limited in that the patient has yet to complete chemotherapy.)

- Conclusion section has been created.

5. Abstract- poor
