**SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS**

In this paper the authors discussed several clinically useful genetic determinants of both treatment responses and side effects. It's an interesting review, that sounds well. My major observation is that the authors should be more critical and clearly state which of



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these genetic tests they believe should be mandatorily included in the clinical practice guidelines. Minor point: - language should be revised for minor mistakes. Only as an example on page 4 the sentence "avoiding the prescription of (expensive) drugs that are either ineffective in or harmful to a particular group of patients" should be reformulated

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
