The manuscript (MS) by Dr. Cascella et al. reviews current therapeutic strategies to treat delirium mostly in the ICU settings. Their review is quite compulsory yet succinct to digest for the target readership of WJCCM. As the scientific field is covered thoroughly



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and the relevant literature is critically appraised, I have no major concerns for this MS. Unfortunately, the MS is not double-spaced and pages / lines are not numbered.
