A serious infection of the liver caused by hepatitis B virus (HBV).

Very rare (Fewer than 20,000 cases per year in US)

Transmitted through direct contact

Usually preventable by vaccine

Diagnosis often requires lab test or imaging

No known cure, treatments available

Can be lifelong

An infection caused by HBV that affects the liver. Spreading through exposure to virus by blood, semen, saliva, or vaginal fluids, the virus is transmitted through unsafe sexual practices and from infected mother to child. Symptoms include loss of appetite, nausea, body aches and fever progressing to jaundice. Chronic form of the infection is not curable, but HBV is preventable by vaccination.
