The authors reported a interesting case of painless chronic intussusception with recurrent lymphoma. This paper is interesting, However, there are some points to be clearly or change before publication Comment; 1. The authors described the medical history of this case, In the Clinical observations section. Although they reported detailed medical history, this part is too redundant. The authors should describe more briefly. 2. This case had the cecal intussusception due to recurrent lymphoma. And the authors showed only colonoscopy and CT findings. Are there any findings of gastrografen or barium enema? This examination can show the characteristic findings of stenosis or obstruction. 3. The authors performed palliative right hemicolectomy after chemotherapy. How longs is the withdrawal period after chemotherapy? 4. Why did the authors perfume the palliative surgery? The patient seemed to had no clinical symptoms such as abdominal pain or obstruction. Minor comment; 1. In the Case presentation section, 3rd paragraph, 'The patient was scheduled for.....three D173ay later.' is typo.
