During fundoplication surgery, the upper curve of the stomach (the fundus) is wrapped around the esophagus and sewn into place so that the lower portion of the esophagus passes through a small tunnel of stomach muscle.

In a Nissen **fundoplication**, also called a complete **fundoplication**, the fundus is wrapped the entire 360 degrees around the esophagus. In contrast, surgery for achalasia is generally accompanied by either a Dor or Toupet partial **fundoplication**, which is less likely than a Nissen **wrap** to aggravate the dysphagia that characterizes achalasia.

Only 2 failures were felt to be due to technical errors during the first operation (1 **twisted wrap** and 1 **misplaced wrap**).
