### **Response to Reviewer 1’s comments**

The authors showed the cases with hemangioma in the small intestine. The disease is rare and the summary is overall well written, therefore can be considered further for its publication.

Thank you for the positive remarks.

1. Are there any possibility that the invagination of the small intestine occurred?

Yes, a case of small bowel cavernous hemangioma complicated with intussusception has been reported (Kuo LW, Chuang HW, Chen YC. *Small bowel cavernous hemangioma complicated with intussusception: report of an extremely rare case and review of literature*. Indian J Surg 2015, 77: 123- 124). Other manifestations, such as massive bleeding, perforation and platelet sequestration may be caused. Therefore although gastrointestinal hemangiomas are rare tumors, they can be present in any presentation unexpectedly.

2. The authors may want to correct the short title in the grammatical aspect.

Following your suggestions, we have shorten the title as *Small bowel racemose hemangioma with obstruction and chronic anemia*.
