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Conventional **endoscopic** biopsy is insufficient for an accurate histopathological **diagnosis**, therefore, a EUS-guided or combined strip biopsy and bite-on-bite biopsy is necessary. On the occasion of EUS guided aspiration, partial **mucosal resection** or **endoscopic** submucosal dissection (ESD) might require.
