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Abstract

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Overlap Syndrome with Autoimmune Hepatitis and Primary ...

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Patients with **autoimmune** liver **disease** frequently fit diagnostic criteria for more than one condition. Up to 12.5% of **autoimmune hepatitis** (AIH) and **primary sclerosing cholangitis** (PSC) cohorts have a label of AIH/PSC **overlap**.

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Primary Sclerosing Cholangitis

Medical Condition

Hardening and narrowing of bile ducts



Chronic liver disease involving inflammation, scarring and narrowing of bile ducts.

- Very rare (Fewer than 20,000 cases per year in US)
- Requires lab test or imaging
- Treatment from medical professional advised
- Can last several months or years

The cause is not clearly understood. These can include: fatigue, pain in the upper right abdomen, night sweats, enlarged spleen, enlarged liver, chills, weight loss, jaundice and itching. The known cure is liver transplant. It can be treated by managing the symptoms using drugs such as antibiotics, opioid antagonists, bile acid sequestrants and ursodeoxycholic acid (UDCA).

Symptoms

The most common symptoms are fatigue and intense itching.
