I have read the comments and done the wanted corrections:

Page4, the last paragraph Please delete the yellowish overlay.

**Answer:** I have removed the yellow overlay now

Page 4, in diffusion techniques, please change 'T2 image' to 'T2-weighted image' because we do not usually calculate T2 in patients with stroke.

**Answer:** I have changed T2 image to T2-weighted image

Conclusion I'm very skeptical with your comments; 'The further use of multi-modality techniques such as PET-CT and PET-MRI can undoubtedly increase our power.' I do not think PET-MRI is useful to manage the patients with acute infarction.

**Answer:** I do agree that PET-MR is maybe somewhat impractical so I have removed the sentence referring to PET at the end

Figures Figure 1; please clarify the time between ictus and initial plain CT in this case.

**Answer:** at 3.5 hours after onset

Figure 3d and e; please clarify the details of the images. These images are too small to identify the abnormality especially in 3d.

**Answer:** I have made the images bigger and written which parameters are measured (rCBF,rCBV,MTT)
