Univariate COX regression analysis showed that gender, tumor size, lymph node metastasis, radical resection, and pathological grading influenced the prognosis of RNETs ($P < 0.05$), while age, distant metastasis, Syn (+), and CgA had no influence on the prognosis of RNETs ($P > 0.05$) Comment: Individual statistical description should be mentioned rather than grouping them together Table 1: Typo error : Positive not posotive Table 2 shows only tumor size to be statistically significant and not the others as mentioned on page 6 paragraph 1. The stats need to be more descriptive and detailed out in the result section.
