In this letter, the authors made a summary about the published article “Caffeine and its main targets of colorectal cancer.” by Cui and coworkers and pointed out that caffeine-containing drinks were difficult to standardize epidemiological studies in humans thus cannot draw consistent conclusions. Therefore, they would like to make additional contributions to the previous study that polyphenols might play a role on the association between espresso coffee and the development colon cancer via antioxidant effect. What’s more, there’s a difference between men and women in carcinogenesis mediated by oxidative stress. This supplement to the previous study is of great significance and it provides ideas for further studies. And the manuscript organized well.
