SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

I have reviewed the case report by Xu and colleagues that reported Hypothyroidism with elevated pancreatic amylase and lipase without clinical symptoms. Generally, the manuscript could add some contribution to its field if the authors can carry out extensive revision to their manuscript in line with my comments as detailed below:

Case summary:L5, suggest to correct 'hypothyroidism is' to 'hypothyroidism was'. Pancreatic lipase which was rather elevated and a key marker of acute pancreatitis is missing in the case summary.

Response: Thank you for your suggestion. They have been revised. Case summary: L5, the 'hypothyroidism is' have been corrected to 'hypothyroidism was'. In the case summary, the key marker of acute pancreatitis have been added in it.

Introduction L6, thyrotropin releasing hormone (TRH) and thyroid stimulating hormone (TSH) levels are elevated as a result of lack of feed back inhibition by thyroxine during conditions of hypothyroidism. Please correct this.

Response: Introduction L6, I have added that “ pituitary thyrotropin (TSH) levels are elevated due to lack of feed back inhibition the relationship of the



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hypothalamic-pituitary-thyroid axis. ”

L14-19, The primary outcome of hypothyroidism, goiter, occasioned by an underactive thyroid gland is missing here.

Response: “Hypothyroidism leads to decrease in the secretion of thyroid hormones, which loses the feedback effect of TRH inhibition, causing thyroid epithelial cells to proliferate, leading to thyroid enlargement. This is a common clinical phenomenon.” was added in the paper.

Physical examination upon admission Why was a check for swelling of the thyroid gland not included in the physical examination, being a primary outcome of hypothyroidism?

Response: In Physical examination, I have added the thyroid gland physical examination.

Laboratory Examination At what day of admission were these results obtained?

Response: The first day of the patient admission.
