However, i do feel certain points could add value to this paper if the authors made it clear to the reader. 1. How robust was their literature sure? Was it a systematic literature review? If so, what was the methodology? 2. The angle is clearly the rare cause - viral in origin as the provoking cause of this thrombotic phenomenon, could the author's provide more information of other viral causes, or microbiological causes as a review as well. 3. Finally and most importantly in the current climate? Did they make at attempt to rule out COVID - 19 in this patient or not? I do believe this would be on the top most of most readers mind as this is also known to cause a prothrombotic or micro thrombotic state.
