Authors have made a good attempt to highlight the reverse symptomatic midgut rotation complicated by pregnancy. There are many grammatical and spelling mistakes, the case report is not up the standard for WJG.

A total of 18 references are cited, including no reference published in the last 3 years.

The authors did not provide original pictures. Please provide the original figure documents. Please prepare and arrange the figures using PowerPoint to ensure that all graphs or arrows or text portions can be reprocessed by the editor

Question 7

PMID and DOI numbers are missing in the reference list. Please provide the PubMed numbers and DOI citation numbers to the reference list and list all authors of the references.

Answer: Thank you very much for pointing out our omission. We have corrected all mistakes about reference. Because ref 7, 8, 18, 21, 28 don't have DOI number, we didn't add it.

Other modifies

In addition to the above modifies, we also corrected the following content to make expression more accurate

1. Physical examination: we add a sentence “without rebound tenderness and rebound tenderness”. In this case, the pregnant woman has no typical signs of peritonitis. Add this sentence will make the expression more accurate.

2. Discussion: In third paragraph: we change “patients are often unable to cooperate with the MRI when patients have serious abdominal pain, that easy to delay the disease” to “patients are often unable to cooperate with the MRI due to a long time taken in this examination”.

3. Table 1: we add a study about pregnancy with intestinal malrotation which published on May 14, 2020 (ref. 26).

4. Table 1: Due to a clerical error, we wrote “NA” as “US” in Line 6, column 3. We have corrected.
