Gastroduodenal intussusception due to the gastrointestinal stromal tumors is infrequently described in the literature. Authors present a case of gastroduodenal intussusception due to the low-risk gastrointestinal stromal tumor resected by endoscopic intervention with complication. There are reports about endoscopic reduction of gastroduodenal intussusception (Park YM, *Clinical Gastroenterology and Hepatology*, 2019;17:e133-e133) and endoscopic resection of tumor to prevent recurrence of gastroduodenal intussusception as cited by the authors (Yamauchi K, et al. *Intern Med* 2017;56:1515-9). The presentation of the case is satisfactory and describes a rare case.
