This manuscript has organized the important events from the introduction of the concept of oligometastases to the recent research trends from NSCLC with oligometastatic disease in order of time. In addition, it is an excellent manuscript that deals with the strengths and limitations of the SINDAS study designed to well explain the role of SBRT in oligometastatic disease and suggests the direction of future research. It is judged that it is enough to be published if only a few errors in the notation are corrected. 1. page 2, “~key criteria to define OMD” -> describe the abbreviation for OMD 2. page 4, “~leading to disseminated disease over time” -> Add a reference to that sentence. 3. page 6, “~ significantly longer in patients” -> Correct the spacing. 4. page 7, “~ at diagnosis for the treatment of oligometastatic NSCLC. -> Correct typos.

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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

I think this is an excellent editorial about SINDAS, and, especially focus on the current clinical research status of stereotactic body radiation therapy (SBRT) for non-small cell lung cancer with oligometastasis. During the manuscript, the author made a thorough review and comment on the design ideas, research characteristics and related research limitations of SINDAS, and proposed ideas for future research directions. Regrettably, I have only read the abstract of the research of SINDAS published online in Journal of Clinical Oncology - , and have not read the detailed data. As a result , I cannot comment on whether all conclusions of this editorial have sufficient basis. In addition, there are several points in the article that need to be corrected. 1. The full name of EORTC should be European Organization for Research on Treatment of Cancer, not European Platform of Cancer Research. 2. The references in the paper do not match with the citations, and need to be checked carefully. E.g. Gomez et al, Lee et al 3. Regarding the SABR-COMET study (The main prospective studies), $p=0.09$, which cannot prove that OS has a significant difference. 4. There are a few spelling errors.
