

# Effect of Hospital Discharge Plan for Children with Type 1 Diabetes on Discharge Readiness, Discharge Education Quality, and Blood Glucose Control

## ABSTRACT

**Objective** To explore the influence of hospital discharge plan based on parental care needs of children with type 1 diabetes mellitus (T1DM) on discharge readiness, quality of discharge education and blood glucose control level.

**Methods** 102 parents of children with type 1 diabetes were divided into

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Recommendation. 15.1 Perform an A1C on all patients with **diabetes** or hyperglycemia (**blood glucose** >140 mg/dL [7.8 mmol/L]) admitted to the **hospital** if not performed in the prior 3 months.B. 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An outpatient follow-up visit with the primary care provider, endocrinologist, or **diabetes** educator within 1 month of **discharge** is advised for all patients having hyperglycemia in the **hospital**. If glycemic medications are changed or **glucose control** is not optimal at **discharge**, continuing contact may be needed to avoid hyperglycemia and ...

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The American **Diabetes** Association (ADA) Standards of Medical Care in **Diabetes** provides clear guidelines for **discharge** planning and self-management **education**. 16 The ADA's revised recommendations published in 2015 reinforce the importance of **diabetes education**: "People with **diabetes** should receive **diabetes** self-management **education** (DSME) and ...

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
