

Effect of Hospital Discharge Plan for Children with Type 1 Diabetes on Discharge Readiness, Discharge Education Quality, and Blood Glucose Control

ABSTRACT

Objective To explore the influence of hospital discharge plan based on parental care needs of children with type 1 diabetes mellitus (T1DM) on discharge readiness, quality of discharge education and blood glucose control level.

Methods 102 parents of children with type 1 diabetes were divided into

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Recommendation. 15.1 Perform an A1C on all patients with diabetes or hyperglycemia (blood glucose >140 mg/dL [7.8 mmol/L]) admitted to the hospital if not performed in the prior 3 months.B.
