Expanding indications for liver transplantation in the era of liver transplant oncology

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Abstract

Despite numerous advances and emerging data, liver transplantation in the setting of gastrointestinal malignancies remains controversial outside of certain accepted indications. In an era of persistent organ shortage and increasing organ demand, allocation of liver grafts must be considered carefully. While hepatocellular carcinoma and hilar cholangiocarcinoma have become accepted indications for transplantation,

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Recent studies from Norway have shown an encouraging 5-year OS of 50% when transplanting patients with NRCLM. Nevertheless, the main concern when expanding the indications for LT is organ shortage. To manage this organ shortage, strategies utilizing live donor liver transplantation are gaining favor.

Liver Transplant

Medical Procedure

A surgical procedure where the diseased liver is replaced with a healthy liver from a donor.

- Type of procedure: Open
- Recovery time: Can take several months
- Duration: About 6-12 hours
- Hospital stay: Typically several days

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What to expect before procedure

- The evaluation performed to assess if the patient is a suitable candidate for a liver transplant involves several lab, imaging tests and psychological assessment that span through multiple hospital visits.
- Blood tests, urine tests, lung function tests, tests to check the functioning of heart etc; are performed.
- In addition to lab or imaging tests such as pulmonary function tests, coronary artery catheterization, chest X- ray, CT scan, kidney and liver function tests, other blood tests, information about the

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Patients should be considered for liver transplantation if they have evidence of fulminant hepatic failure, a life-threatening systemic complication of liver disease, or a liver-based metabolic defect or, more commonly, cirrhosis with complications such as hepatic encephalopathy, ascites, hepatocellular carcinoma, hepatorenal syndrome, or bleeding caused by portal hypertension.
