The review describes a rare entity of localized amyloidosis. The title, abstract, background, subchapters, and discussion are well written. Language and grammar require additional polishing. I would like to ask the authors to clarify whether it is possible to define a subgroup of patients or populations, according to the characteristics and comorbidities that are at risk for this condition. Since the disease was presented by bleeding from the gastrointestinal tract, which is the eventual role of standard risk factors f(NSAID, infections,...) for the occurrence of this disease and the risk of bleeding? What is the role of IPP in therapy?
