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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The paper needs absolutely to be re-written from an English native speaking physician. It is full of errors, awkward expressions, that will make it very hard to read for a global audience, who craves for a good terminology. Kindly re-consider also the structure of the manuscript. You cannot propose guidelines in such a confusing form. There is an overall scale when proposing interventions: from expert opinions / to large-scale, multi-center studies with double blind control procedures. Thus, 'acupotomy', 'internal heated needle' (??), need to be explained and you must as well uphold suggestions with sound data, derived from A-class studies (evidence - based medicine); as well as quoting thoroughly sources that have applied successfully the procedures. 'Human meridians' will be hardly understood from western anesthesiologists: I do not mean you're wrong. You just need to approach the issue globally. The journal is an international, prestigious one; and guidelines must be of a large value, if not universal. Further errors: "multimode analgesia" (multimodal; which modes ?); 'injectio' (injection)...; 'it is hoped".... Other sentences needing re-writing: Analgesics is the first choice in the treatment of pain. How to use drugs safely and effectively, and how to treat chronic pain effectively, need to follow the guidance and suggestions of expert consensus and guidelines. Also, I have rarely seen any paper without references (editorials included): how about quoting important sources?

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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This editorial celebrates the growing role of pain therapy in Chinese Medicine by promulgating 10 guidelines and consensus statements. My comments are directed at the organization and conclusion. In stating that there are 10 guidelines and consensus statements, I would then indicate "which are grouped by their relevance to 1) Chronic Pain, 2) Pharmacologic Therapy and 3) Interventional Therapy. The heading "Medicine Therapeutic Aspects is not in bold, so, particularly because there is no indication of 3 sections, it is unclear what this is. "Algology aspects" does not seem like a good section heading. Finally, in the conclusion. This body of work represents a great start by the CASP, but what are the future goals and objectives, long and short term. A few specific sentences about this would be more forward looking.

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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

You summarize a guideline and consensuses on the diagnosis and treatment of pain that are recommended by the Chinese association for the study of pain. These recommendations are important for pain treatment in China. Your descriptions are not consistent. The introduction says that “the issue contains 10 consensus and guidelines.” However, the algology aspects say that “the issue contains one guideline and three expert consensus. The body of the manuscript shows one guideline and 9 consensuses. WHICH is right? I would recommend that the manuscript be written as follows:

1. Guideline Cervicogenic headache
2. Consensus 1) Diagnosis and treatment of lumbar disc herniation Lumbar disc.... 2) Diagnosis and treatment of myofascial pain syndrome Myofascial pain syndrome refers.... 3) ...

Specific comments:
Page1 First paragraph, line 3: What is the subject for “required?” Line 6: I would recommend “various” for “different” pain diseases. Line 9: I would recommend inserting “in” between “and” and “establishing.” Last line of guideline I would recommend “are recommended [to guide] invasive therapies.” Page 3 Line 1: “Injectio” should be “injectio[n].” Line 5: “Surgical-related” should be “surgery”-related or “surgically related.” Page 5 Line 1 of “Ozone treatment”: Treatment “to” pain should be treatment “of” pain. END
