

Supplementary Table 1 Clavien-Dindo classifications of post-operative complications

	Grades	Definition
Low Grade Complications	Grade I	Any deviation from the normal postoperative course without the need for pharmacological treatment or surgical, endoscopic and radiological interventions Allowed therapeutic regimens are: drugs as antiemetic's, antipyretics, analgesics, diuretics and electrolytes and physiotherapy. This grade also includes wound infections opened at the bedside.
	Grade II	Requiring pharmacological treatment with drugs other than such allowed for grade I complications. Blood transfusions and total parenteral nutrition are also included.
	Grade III - IIIa - IIIb	Requiring surgical, endoscopic or radiological intervention Intervention not under general anaesthesia Intervention under general anaesthesia
High Grade Complications	Grade IV - IVa - IVb	Life-threatening complication (including CNS complications) requiring IC/ICU-management Single organ dysfunction (including dialysis) Multi-organ dysfunction
	Grade V	Death of a patient
