The authors have highlighted the details regarding the management of the patient. However, several issues must be addressed: - It's better to demonstrate in details in the presentation section the histological features that led to the diagnosis of all neoplasms; mainly the DLBCL, IPMN, Gastric cancer... - It would be better to discuss the differential diagnoses in the discussion section, and demonstrate in details the histological and immunohistochemical similarities between them.

Since IPMN was defined as an independent disease, its unique characteristics have led to many detailed studies. In particular, IPMN-associated pancreatic cancer and extrapancreatic malignancy are focused on. These cases should be managed timely and optimally to improve outcomes and extend patients' lives. Diffuse large B-cell lymphoma (DLBCL) can appear together with early gastric cancer in IPMN and is usually difficult to diagnose before surgery. It is recommend ESD for early gastric cancer with local lymphoma. It is the first report of pancreatic cancer comorbid with in situ collision of extrapancreatic malignancies (early gastric cancer and DLBCL) in a follow-up IPMN patient.
