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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The article entitled "Polycystic ovary syndrome: nonalcoholic fatty liver disease, gut microbiome, metabolic consequences and susceptibility to COVID-19" was read with interest. The present review surely contributes to understanding the relationship between metabolic diseases and COVID-19 infection. However, this is a paper that still needs a lot of work in order to be publishable. Specific Comments: 1. The abstract should be more clarified with current status, purpose and what are the main advanced knowledge or information. 2. The title is confusing and should be revised. 3. Part "PCOS AND THE GUT MICROBIOME": More attention should be paid to the relationship between host immunity and the gut microbiota. 4. Part "PCOS VS SARS-COV-2 INFECTION": This section needs to have more appropriate references. In fact, as the core content of the whole article, this part needs to add some more information. 5. Part "NAFLD AND THE GUT MICROBIOME": This part seems redundant for this review, which does not elaborate the authors' view very well. 6. Most of the review focus on the relationship between Polycystic ovary syndrome, NAFLD or gut microbiome, which has been well known in published article, However, few elucidated the relationship between PCOS and COVID-19, and also the possible mechanism involved.
