Thank you very much for forwarding the referee's reports on our manuscript. We also appreciated your advice and encouragement. Our manuscript has been revised according to the referee's comments. We have provided point-by-point responses below and the changes in the manuscript have been highlighted in red font.

Reviewer #1 comments:

Authors in the Limitations section should put emphases on the lack of determination of IL-16, which is the main cytokine involved in the so called chronic low-grade inflammation or meta inflammation of NAFLD/NASH, as evident inFront Immunol. 2020; 11: 769.

Response: Thank you very much for your valuable suggestion. The cytokine the reviewer suggested appears to be IL-6, but not IL-16. Another study has indicated IL-6, IL-1 β , and TNF- α as the cytokines involved in dietary-induced low-grade inflammation in the liver (Guerra et al., Biomedicines, 2020). We have referred to the cytokines involved in the chronic low-grade inflammation or meta inflammation of NAFLD/NASH in the discussion (Page 23, lines 455-457), limitation (Page 25, lines 509-510), and reference (Page 37, lines 756-761) sections.

Authors should clearly state in the Introduction section that the mechanisms underlying NAFLD/NASH are far from being clarified and the gut-liver axis is only a part of the pathogenesis of this disease, because of the complex, multidirectional pathophysiology involved in NAFLD as clearly evidenced in... J. Clin. Med. 2020, 9(1), 15.

Response: Thank you very much for this important suggestion. We have revised the manuscript according to the reviewer's suggestion (Page 7, lines 133-136), and added the reference (Page 31, lines 624-626).

Authors should put emphasis on the fact that the animal models do not completely mirror the human NAFLD/NASH, thus a note of caution in translating these results is mandatory, as

Response: Thank you very much for this important comment. We totally agree with you and have revised the manuscript accordingly (Pages 21-22, lines 433-437) and added the reference (Page 36, lines 743-745).

Authors should present their data as means plus/minus SD and not SEM, because readers are interested in knowing the dispersion of values but not the price vision of the mean, due to the paucity of observations in each group, i.e., seven.

Response: Thank you very much for your valuable suggestion. We have changed SEM into SD for all data (Fig 1-6, Table 3-4). In Table 4, the mean values are the same, but there were miscalculations in the SEM, which were partially corrected when changing to SD.

Finally, authors should evidence in the Limitations section the modest sample size of each group of the study.

Response: Thank you very much for your valuable suggestion. We have checked the sample size and added the sentence in the limitations section (Page 25, lines 510-512).

Response: We have revised the manuscript according to the reviewer's suggestions.
