Concerns 1. The first appearance of abbreviations such as “ASD, EEG, GERD, IGG” in manuscript without Abstract Part should be stated in detail. 2. Is there really a definition of “Excitopathy”? 3. Some words were misspelled and should be revised. Such as: Increased excitability in the developed brain causes “imapiored” plasticity which in turn induces both cognitive deficits. “imapiored” should be “impaired”. 4. The CONCLUSION PART is a little bit tedious. It will be better if shorter and concise.
