1 Scientific quality: The manuscript describes a review of the emerging applications of radiomics in rectal cancer. The topic is within the scope of the WJG. (1) Classification: Grade A; (2) Summary of the Peer-Review Report: The authors have provided a comprehensive and state of the art summary of recent developments in the field of radiomics, with a focus on rectal cancer. The manuscript is well put together and well written; and (3) Format: There is 1 table and 3 figures. (4) References: A total of 64 references are cited, including 30 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There are no self-cited references; and (6) References recommend: The authors have the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by peer reviewer(s), especially the references published by the peer reviewer(s) themselves.
