T Shirai Bourcier et al. provided a review about NOMI. Overall, this review is well written. However, intestinal vasculitis including PAN occasionally presents NOMI, and this should be reviewed as the pit-falls of work-up.

*Following your recommendation, we included a part describing PAN: "Several other smaller cohorts also reported hemodialysis as a setting associated with a risk of NOMI [11]. In a retrospective study of 57 cases occurring in the first 12 hours after the last hemodialysis session, all cases were preceded by an episode of hypotension during hemodialysis, and investigations found diffuse ( $\geq 3$ ) ischemic areas, in 20% of cases [12]. Vasculitis were also reported as an occasional cause of NOMI, especially polyarteritis nodosa[13]."*

However, in the description of medical imaging in the paper, the authors have used the word "imagery" many times. In fact, this word has never been used in the medical imaging literature. Following your recommendation, a radiologist specialist proofread the manuscript and suggested to systematically use the term "imaging" instead of "imagery". Thank you.*
