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Moise N et al.: Primary care and mental health: Where do we go from here? In this editorial, a primary care physician and two psychiatrists review difficulties with implementation of collaborative care in academic primary care settings and they propose systemic changes to improve the dissemination of mental health treatment in primary care. Comment to improve the quality of the manuscript: Introduction, 2nd sentence: authors state here, that 'CC has proven effective in improving..., clinical outcomes (e.g., A1c)'. In a meta-analysis, Christina Van der Feltz-Cornelis et al. (Gen Hosp Psychiatry. 2010 Jul-Aug;32(4):380-95.) found that while CC significantly improved depressive symptoms, had no effect on glycemic control in patients with DM.
