Science Editor: 1 Scientific quality: The manuscript describes a Guideline of the retinopathy of prematurity screening during the COVID-19 pandemic. The topic is within the scope of the WJCP. (1) Classification: Grade C; (2) Summary of the Peer-Review Report: In this situation, it would be a good idea to think about writing once. Several modifications might be needed though. In the case of a solution in the text, such as alcohol or water, it would be good to clearly state the correct concentration and what kind of water it is. The questions raised by the reviewers should be answered; (3) Format: There are 3 tables; (4) References: A total of 13 references are cited, including 11 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There are 6 self-cited references. The self-referencing rates should be less than 10%. Please keep the reasonable self-citations (i.e. those that are most closely related to the topic of the manuscript) and remove all other improper self-citations. If the authors fail to address the critical issue of self-citation, the editing process of this manuscript will be terminated; and (6) References recommendations: The authors have the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by the peer reviewer(s), especially references published by the peer reviewer(s) him/herself (themselves).
