Coronary artery stenosis and the myocardial blood supply decreases constantly and even terminates, resulting in severe myocardial ischemia or myocardial necrosis that leads to myocardial infarction and related complications, which have a serious impact on the life and health of patients. The labor loss and prognosis are far greater than those on medium-elderly patients. This study examined the coronary arteries and clinical features of young and medium-elderly male coronary heart disease patients. Total 110 coronary heart disease patients were included in this study, and the clinical data, coronary artery lesion features and related blood lipids index factors were observed. The methods are described in detail. The results of clinical data, coronary artery lesion characteristics and blood lipid related index in between the group patients were interesting. The manuscript is very well written. Minor comments: 1. A minor editing is required for the manuscript. Some minor language polishing should be corrected. 2. The section 3 should be "discussion" not conclusion. Please check and revise. 3. Data in tables are interesting. However, the tables structures should be checked and revised. And the $X \pm S$ should be changed to mean \pm SD.

Thank you for your advice.

After receiving the comments, we read the article carefully and found some small loopholes in the language of the article and made modifications. We changed the "conclusion" in the third part to "discussion", and checked and revised the structure of the table, changing $X \pm S$ to $\pm SD$.
