Although the patient cohort is small, the results of this study are very interesting and promising. Moreover, the manuscript is well-written, but needs improvement. In this context, the questions raised by the reviewer should be answered; (3) Format: There are 3 tables and 2 figures; moreover, there are 2 supplementary tables. All tables are informative and both Figures are of good quality; (4)

References: A total of 21 references are cited, including 5 references published in the last 3 years. The authors have cited several important papers relevant to their study; however, the reference list needs to be expanded, in order to include more important papers relevant to this study; (5) Self-cited references: There are 3 self-cited references. The self-referencing rate should be less than 10%. If the authors expand the number of references (>30) and keep the currently self-cited references, then the number of self-citations will be reasonable; moreover, the current self-citations are considered to be proper. If the authors fail to address the critical issue of self-citation, the editing process of this manuscript will be References recommendations: The authors have terminated; (6) the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by the peer reviewer(s), especially those published by the peer reviewer(s)
