With the increase of aortic stenosis, Heyde's syndrome is also increasing and needs to be studied in detail. The manuscript is well written; however, reviewer have some comments to the manuscript. Major comment 1. There are no abstract. 2. Authors should discuss the outcome of GI bleeding after aortic valve replacement or TAVR. (Suggest to make one new chapter) Most cases of Heyde's syndrome, uncontrolled GI bleeding is the reason for invasive treatment. 3. Authors should note the surgical aortic valve replacement, especially comparison between bio-prosthetic valve and mechanical valve at "Approach to Aortic stenosis in Heyde's syndrome" session. Minor comment 1. If you can, please discuss the outcome of acquired vWS after aortic valve replacement or TAVR. 2. There are few typos and grammatical errors, the reviewer advises to receive a native speaker's check.
