In conclusion, the author stated "We conclude that HE can cause CVST, and a high eosinophil count is an initial diagnostic clue of this condition. " However, the author didn't provide the direct evidence showing the colitis and cerebral venous sinus were eosinophilic disorders in this case. The patient complained diarrhea at first, and colonoscopy was important to clarify the diagnosis. Besides, there were still many conditions related to hypereosinophilia, including inflammation bowel disease. Colonic biopsy was also needed to prove the diagnosis of eosinophilic colitis. According to the clinical course, we could only conclude HE with CVST and colitis.
